



Sharjah Emirate's Baby, Child and Family-Friendly Achievements A 50-year journey

The Sharjah Child Friendly Office (SCFO) was established under the directives of His Highness Sheikh Dr. Sultan bin Mohammad Al Qasimi, Member of the Supreme Council and Ruler of Sharjah, and his wife, Her Highness Sheikha Jawaher bint Mohammed Al Qasimi, Chairperson of Supreme Council for Family Affairs, to work in collaboration with relevant bodies to design and implement targeted strategies and programs to support the rights of children and youth. SCFO is the official body tasked with granting 'Child Friendly' and 'Baby & Family Friendly' accreditations to relevant entities in Sharjah and works with national and international organizations to implement accreditation programs to further promote children's rights.

Sharjah's care for children and youth started in the early 1950s, when the first scout troop in the UAE was established. Sharjah has been leading in childhood and motherhood services in the country since the 1970's. This was evident as Sharjah was the first emirate to set up pioneer services dedicated to children and mothers including special needs children as illustrated below. Sharjah, being innovative in supporting children, mothers, and families, introduced 4 working days week. The below table summarizes the major historical milestones with the links for further information followed by the impact of the projects and the list of publications by SCFO.


